


Today, the seed.

Tomorrow, the growth.


- Developing the project through ongoing engagement

Future, the harvest.


- Leaders in the generation of sustainable energy

Why this site?

- Proximity to PLFN community
- Favorable central grid interconnection point
- Land is owned and controlled by PLFN and is not contemplated for other uses withing the PLFN Land Use Plan
- Access to existing infrastructure
- Allows for future integration of battery storage
