RE: Rapid Housing Initiative 3.0 (Update)

Attention Community Members,

The housing department would like to apologize to everyone about the miscommunication involving the RHI 3.0 application. Community members were contacted to find out if they were still interested in submitting their "Request for Housing" applications and, if so, the housing department needed to know if their information was up to date and accurate.

Approval of the RHI 3.0 applications is based on a points system. The more points you score the more likely your application will be approved. There are different categories where we need to score points (and as many as possible). All the housing department was doing when contacting community members, was gathering up to date data that would used in our application process.

This was never meant to guarantee that anyone would get a house. In fact, the application, itself is not guaranteed that it will be approved. We received funding in the First Round. Which means that we will not be prioritized in this new round. Any community/municipality who did not receive any funding in the first two rounds will be in front of the line. If an application is not 100 % properly filled out, it will not be approved.

CMHC will not provide any updates until July 1 when they announce the recipients whose applications were approved.
